## Stage 1

First Incident: Verbal warning and name written on board.





## **Stage 2:** Yellow Card

Second incident: 5 minutes in class at the end of the lesson to discuss behaviour with Class Teacher.

Your class teacher will speak to your parents to inform them that you have been given a yellow card.

Your class teacher will keep a list of any yellow cards that you are given and this will be shared with your parents at parents evening.





### **Stage 3:** Red Card

If you continue to break the rules, you will get a red 'Consequence Card' which means that you have to go to detention on Thursday lunchtime.

A Red Letter will be given to your parents asking them to come and speak to your class teacher.

Your class teacher will keep a record of this and inform Mrs Bostock and Mrs Coleman.

You will be put onto Head Teachers Report Card for 1 week.
