Use this pack to create a display board in your school and help share the Speak out Stay safe messages throughout the year. We can work together to help keep children safe by sharing the programme's key messages all year.

Speak out Stay safe is our safeguarding programme for 5-11 year olds. It's available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It teaches children what abuse is, that abuse is never a child's fault and that they have the right to be safe. It also teaches them that they can speak to a safe adult or to Childline if they need help or support.
